A Short History of ROTC at West Virginia State College

West Virginia State College was founded in 1891 as one of sixty Land Grant Colleges in the United States. As provided in section four of the Morrill Act, military training was a requirement. With this authorization, in addition to agriculture, mechanical arts, etc., Military Tactics was taught. The ROTC Department of West Virginia State College, as we now know it today, began shortly after with the establishment of a military corps in 1899.

While provisions for military training were not specifically included in the language of the West Virginia State Legislative Act establishing West Virginia Colored Institute, training was conducted during the school's first year in existence.

This tacit agreement marked the first organized military activity at present day West Virginia State College (WVSC). Military training continued at the college with the exception of temporary suspension during the years of 1907-1916 and 1920-1942.

Much of the credit for the establishment of the present ROTC program goes to Mr. Daniel P. Lincoln, a former registrar, and Professor Daniel L. Ferguson, (both deceased) for whom the ROTC building was named. Their success in conducting military training on a voluntary basis early in World War II laid the ground work for the War Department's recognition of the college's desire to continue with the ROTC program.

In 1942, a Senior ROTC Unit was established at West Virginia State College providing instruction in Field Artillery. This Unit was the only one of its kind in the country approved by the War Department for a Negro College. Artillery, as a subject, was taught until 1956 when the department was redesignated as a General Military Science Program. This meant that cadets could receive General Military Instruction with emphasis on fundamentals common to all branches of the Army, and that graduates could be commissioned in any of its eighteen branches.

The Military Science Department acquired an elective status in 1970 and ceased to be a mandatory program for which all male students were required to enroll. The military science program at West Virginia State College has, traditionally been an integral part of the College's existence since its founding.

VANDY L. MILLER COLONEL, RETIRED

COLONEL VANDY L. MILLER IS A NATIVE OF BLUEFIELD, WEST VIRGINIA. HE ATTENDED PUBLIC SHCOOLS IN GARY AND BLUEFIELD, WEST VIRGINIA. UPON GRADUATION, HE ATTENDED WEST VIRGINIA STATE COLLEGE. COLONEL MILLER WAS A FOUR-YEAR LETTERMAN IN FOOTBALL, CO-CAPTAIN OF THE TEAM AND WAS HONORED BY BEING NAMED TO THE JACKIE ROBINSON ALL AMERICAN TEAM IN 1953. HE WAS INDUCTED IN THE WVSC SPORTS HALL OF FAME IN 1986.

COLONEL MILLER TOOK ON JOBS OF INCREASING RESPONSIBILITY DURING HIS TWENTY-FOUR YEARS OF ACTIVE MILITARY SERVICE. AS CHIEF HEALTH PHYSICIST AT WALTER REED MEDICAL CENTER, HE REORGANIZED THE HEALTH PHYSICS OFFICE TO SUPPORT WALTER REED ARMY INSTITUTE OF RESEARCH, ARMED FORCES INSTITUTE OF PATHOLOGY, WALTER REED GENERAL HOSPITAL, AND THE BIO-MEDICAL LABORATORY, FORT DETRICK, MARYLAND. AS EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND DIRECTOR OF OPERATIONS, U. S. ARMY NUCLEAR MEDICAL RESEARCH DETACHMENT EUROPE, HE WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR EVALUATING THE NUCLEAR DEFENSE POSTURE OF ARMY UNITS IN THE EUROPEAN THEATRE.

COLONEL MILLER'S MILITARY TRAINING INCLUDES THE ARMY MEDICAL DEPARTMENT OFFICER'S BASIC AND ADVANCE COURSES, COMMAND AND GENERAL STAFF COLLEGE AND SEVERAL POST GRADUATE COURSES IN RADIATION PROTECTION AND NUCLEAR MEDICAL SCIENCE. HIS MILITARY HONORS INCLUDE THE LEGION OF MERIT, MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDAL, ARMY COMMENDATION MEDAL WITH TWO OAK LEAF CLUSTERS AND THE NATIONAL DEFENSE SERVICE MEDAL.

COLONEL MILLER IS A STRONG SUPPORTER OF WEST VIRGINIA STATE COLLEGE. HE IS THE MOST RECENT PRESIDENT OF WEST VIRGINIA STATE COLLEGE NATIONAL 'W' CLUB ASSOCIATION. HE IS VERY ACTIVE IN THE WASHINGTON METROPOLITAN ALUMNI CHAPTER OF WEST VIRGINIA STATE COLLEGE AND A LIFE MEMBER OF THE NATIONAL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION.

COLONEL MILLER IS CURRENTLY BEMPLOYED BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT AS A MEMBER OF THE SENIOR EXECUTIVE SERVICE WITH THE UNITED STATES NUCLEAR REGULATORY COMMISSION.

HE AND HIS WIFE, SYLVIA, LIVE IN SILVER SPRING, MARYLAND AND THEY HAVE THREE CHILDREN, KERWIN, KARAN, AND KARMEN AND ONE GRANDDAUGHTER, MARKIA.

HERMAN H. JONES COLONEL

COLONEL JONES ENTERED THE UNITED STATES ARMY ON AUGUST 11, 1964 FOLLOWING COMMISSIONING FROM THE WVSC ROTC PROGRAM. AFTER SERVING TWO YEARS IN THE INFANTRY BRANCH, COLONEL JONES EMBARKED ON A DISTINGUISHED CAREER IN THE ORDNANCE CORPS SPECIALIZING IN NUCLEAR WEAPONS MANAGEMENT AND LOGISTICS. CAREER PROGRESSION FOLLOWED A VARIETY OF COMMAND AND STAFF ASSIGNMENTS WITH TOURS OF DUTY IN VIETNAM, KOREA, WEST GERMANY AND THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES.

DURING THE MID-1980'S, COLONEL JONES PLAYED A KEY ROLE IN THE NUCLEAR WEAPONS MODERNIZATION PROGRAM IN WESTERN EUROPE. AS THE PRINCIPAL STAFF OFFICER RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ACCOUNTABILITY, INTEGRATED MANAGEMENT, DEPLOYMENT AND RETIREMENT OF ALL TACTICAL NUCLEAR WEAPONS AND GUIDED MISSILES ASSIGNED TO U.S. ARMY FORCES AND NATO. COLONEL JONES WAS INSTRUMENTAL IN COORDINATING THE PLANNING EFFORT AND CONDUCTING THE DEPLOYMENT OF THE CONTROVERSIAL PERSHING II MEDIUM RANGE MISSILE SYSTEM TO EUROPE. HIS DEMONSTRATED KNOWLEDGE AND PERFORMANCE LED TO HIS SELECTION BY THE UNDER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE TO BE A MEMBER OF A SIX MEMBER PANEL THAT PROMULGATED OPERATIONAL SAFETY RULES AND GRANTED NUCLEAR SAFETY CERTIFICATION TO THE USS OHIO, THE NATION'S FIRST TRIDENT SUBMARINE, AS WELL AS MANY OTHER MAJOR NAVY STRATEGIC WEAPON SYSTEMS.

COLONEL JONES IS CURRENTLY SERVING AS COMMANDER, U.S. ARMY MATERIEL COMMAND SURETY FIELD ACTIVITY IN DOVER, NEW JERSEY. IN THIS CAPACITY, HE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR ASSESSING POLICY COMPLIANCE AND OPERATIONAL EFFICIENCY OF THE ARMY'S NUCLEAR WEAPONS AND LETHAL CHEMICAL MUNITIONS STORAGE DEPOTS; CHEMICAL RESEARCH, DEVELOPMENT AND TEST LABORATORIES; AND, NUCLEAR REACTOR FACILITIES THROUGHOUT THE UNITED STATES.

COLONEL JONES' MILITARY HONORS INCLUDE THE BRONZE STAR MEDAL, THE DEFENSE MERITORIOUS SERVICE MEDAL, THE MERITORIOUS SRVICE MEDAL WITH TWO OAK LEAF CLUSTERS, AND THE ARMY COMMENDATION MEDAL.

COLONEL JONES IS MARRIED TO THE FORMER BARBARA JEAN FRANCIS, ALSO A WVSC GRADUATE. HE AND HIS WIFE, BARBARA, ARE THE PARENTS OF TWO SONS AND ONE DAUGHTER.

JAMES W. VALLANDINGHAM COLONEL

JAMES W. VALLANDINGHAM IS A NATIVE OF HINTON WEST VIRGINIA. HE GRADUATED FROM HINTON HIGH SCHOOL. HE HAS A BACHELOR'S DEGREE IN ECONOMICS FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF CHARLESTON, A MASTER OF SCIENCE DEGREE IN EDUCATION FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AND A MASTER OF PUBLIC HEALTH DEGREE FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF PITTSBURGH. HE HAS GRADUATED FROM THE BASIC AND ADVANCED (MSC) COURSES, THE U.S. ARMY ADJUTANT GENERAL SCHOOL PERSONNEL COURSE, THE UNITED STATES ARMY INTELLIGENCE SCHOOL IMAGARY INTERPRETATION COURSE, THE UNITED STATES AIR FORCE AIR GROUND OPERATIONS COURSE, THE UNITED STATES ARMY COMMAND AND GENERAL STAFF COLLEGE AND THE INDUSTRIAL COLLEGE OF THE ARMED FORCES.

COLONEL JAMES W. REED, A DISTINGUISHED MILITARY GRADUATE OF WEST VIRGINIA STATE COLLEGE ARMY ROTC IN 1954, IS A NATIVE OF SAINT PETERSBURG, FLORIDA.

WHILE ON ACTIVE DUTY, COLONEL REED ATTENDED THE FIELD ARTILLERY OFFICER'S BASIC COURSE, FORT SILL, OKLAHOMA, GUIDED MISSILE STAFF OFFICER'S COURSE, FORT BLISS, TEXAS, MEDICAL OFFICER'S BASIC COURSE, FORT SAM HOUSTON, TEXAS, AND RESIDENCY, INTERNAL MEDICINE, MADIGAN ARMY MEDICAL CENTER, TACOMA, WASHINGTON, HE OBTAINED HIS DOCTORATE DEGREE IN MEDICAL EDUCATION AT HOWARD UNIVERSITY COLLEGE OF MEDICINE, WASHINGTON, D.C., AND CONDUCTED POST DOCTORATE RESEARCH IN ENDOCRINOLOGY AND METABOLISM AT UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, SAN FRANCISCO, CALIFORNIA.
