

### A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE WEST VIRGINIA STATE COLLEGE NATIONAL "W" CLUB

On a fall West Virginia Sunday morning in 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston, West Virginia hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm as to how to raise funds for athletics as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a very distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club elected at the 1976 meeting were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome, and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, DC was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters. The Institute Chapter and the Shennandoah Chapter which is located in Martinsburg, WV. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishing of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were: Chester A. Burris; Mark H. Cardwell; Samuel A. Gamble; Vasco D. Hale; Adolph P. Hamblin; Louis R. W. Johnson; Earl Lloyd; Floyd Meadows; Roderick L. Price and Marvin H. Richardson.

Former presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller and Madison Broadnax. In 1990, Henry R. Bellinger was elected to the presidency. Currently Rupert Currry serves as president.

On October 13, 1990, the WVSC Sports Hall of Fame, dedicated to Coach Mark H. Cardwell, was opened. This facility located in the Canty House on the campus of West Virginia State College, showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State College athletes.




Samuel B. Chilton, Jr.

Samuel Blackwell Chilton, Jr. was born in Baltimore, Maryland, July 8, 1934. He was educated in Kanawha County, West Virginia public schools, and was graduated from Stonewall Jackson High School in 1951. He graduated Magna Cum Laude in 1958 from West Virginia State College with a Bachelor of Science degree in Education

While at WVSC, Sam was the College Athlete of the Year, the first swimmer to achieve that distinction. He won gold at the CIAA Championship meet in the 200 yard individual medley Sam captained the swimming team the next two seasons setting the WVIAC conference record in the individual medley and winning the one-meter Springboard Diving Championship known as "Sailfish Sam" on campus for his prowess in aquatics, and friendly outgoing personality, he shared his knowledge arid skills with all whom he came in contact. He was also the college chess champion Sam was Coaches Mark Cardwell's and Grant Gray's baseball scorekeeper. He assisted Coach Chester A. "Art" Burris in teaching swimming and lifesaving skills while honing his own for the future. While re-acquiring the necessary teaching credentials at WVSC in 1983 and '84, Sam continued his aquatic activities, winning the high point trophy in intramural swimming competition both years. This occurred in his 49th and 50th years of age, as he swept all events but two on the agenda.

Since retiring from the Kanawha County school system, Sam, has continued his swimming at the Regional and National levels. He as been recognized in the "Top Ten" in his age group in the grueling butterfly swims consistently carrying that distinction in the 200 meter event, his specialty.




## Russell Clark

Rusty and his wife, Debbie, have 2 children, Tyler and Reilly, He is the manager of Salomon Smith Barney in Huntington.




## Alan L. Hamilton

### Ernest Kent


As the youngest of six children, four boys and two girls, Ernest was always trying to keep up with his older brothers. In high school he began to excel in sports and soon learned that if he was good enough, he could be the first in his family to attend college. He played basketball, football, and ran track. His father passed when he was seven years old and his coaches became his father figures and helped him realize his dream.

Everyone in the family and community celebrated when they found that Ernest would be attending West Virginia State College. He took pride in playing football at "State" and formed relationships that would last a lifetime.

After graduation, he entered the military as an officer in the army. He became the first Black Battery Commander in the 82nd Airborne.

He later moved to Detroit, Michigan and became partners with Joseph Durant and opened K-D TV Sales & Service in Pontiac and successfully operated it until his death.

Ernest loved West Virginia State and attended homecoming every year.



Taylor Perry

After graduating from high school in Cincinnati, Ohio in 1956, Taylor accepted a scholarship to play football and box at West Virginia State College. While matriculating at WV State, he joined the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, was selected as "All Conference" guard and linebacker on the football team for two years and was light heavyweight boxing champion for four years. He traveled to New York City and fought in the Eastern. Regional Boxing finals at the old Madison Square Gardens on 50th Street.


In 1960, Taylor enlisted in the U. S. Army where be again became involved in athletics and won the "2nd Army" and "All Army" Boxing Champion in 1961-62. He was a member of the "All Military" Championship football team at Ft. Eustis, Virginia in 1961 and played with his former WV State roommate, Cyril Hawkins.

Taylor was fortunate enough to play a few years of professional football in New Jersey and New York City in the early 1960's and again with a couple of former WV State graduates, Bobby Wright and Olie Colvin. Taylor returned to WVSC in 1968 to complete his B.A. degree; proceeded to West Virginia University where he earned his Masters in 1972 and Doctorate in 1975.

Dr. Perry is currently employed as Director of Pupil Service with the Berkeley County Board of Education in Martinsburg, West Virginia. Prior to his appointment with the Central Office Staff, Taylor was Assistant Principal at Martinsburg High School and a Guidance Counselor at Musselman High both in Berkeley County

He is a lifetime member of the West Virginia State "W" Club and has received permission from the National "W" Club to start a "W" Club organization in the Eastern Panhandle of WV.

Taylor is the very proud father of four and grandfather of two.




Alfred L. Williams

Al, a native of Chicago, Ilinois, the son of Rose Williams & the late Ivory Williams, graduated from Chicago Vocational High School in January, 1964, where he starred in football and wrestling. He entered WVSC in the fall of '64 at the insistence of his uncle, Frank Bacon (WVSC '51), Al lettered all four years in football playing in positions as tight-end, cornerback, linebacker, and kicker when needed. He received the "Honorable Mention Award 1966 All-WVIAC Football". "Showboat" received State's pass catching honors in 1966-67 and was Co-Captain for the 1967 squad. While attending State, he was elected Student Council Representative 1967-68, member of the social committee, dormitory aide (Gore Hall)- President of the Physical Education Club 1967-68 and "Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges & Universities," 1967.

Alfred Williams graduated from State in December, 1968, with a Bachelor of Science degree in Education with teaching areas in Health and Physical Education, Social Studies and Safety Education as a minor, later completing a Master of Arts degree in Education from the University of Michigan in 1973.

Al began his teaching profession in the Chicago Public Schools System and continued his career in Detroit, Michigan. He has taught twenty-two years at the elementary middle levels as an exemplary teacher and served as a volunteer coach for girls and boys in several athletic teams. He is currently teaching health education and coaching the girls' varsity golf and tennis teams at Martin Luther King, Jr. Senior High School in Detroit.

Al and his wife, the former Sylvia A. Wade of Logan, WV, are proud parents of three sons and are expectant grandparents. They have recently celebrated 30 years of marriage.



Charles R. Byrd

Charles Robert Byrd was born in Washington DC on March 12, 1919. He was the second child and oldest son of Robert and Martena Byrd. Another son and two more daughters were born later. He attended Lucretia Mott Elementary School, Garnet-Patterson Junior High School graduating as salutatorian of his class, and Armstrong Technical High School, graduating as valedictorian of the class of 1936. Dr. Byrd then enrolled at Hampton Institute (now Hampton University) and completed the four-year course in three years, receiving a Bachelor of Science degree in Technical Education.

While teaching at Hampton, Dr. John W. Davis, President of West Virginia State College, requested that Dr. Byrd be transferred to fill a position under a federal contract. He complied, and joined the ranks of the WVSC faculty on January 3, 1942, on a temporary basis which lasted for fifty-seven years. He did not get back to Hampton until fifty years later for his class reunion in 1989 and has not been there since then.

Dr. Byrd initiated the Communication Department at WVSC and developed the program which led to the EdNet Facility. He was responsible for setting up and operating a public address system and became known as "the-voice of the Yellow Jackets" because he was the announcer for all football games, basketball games, and most other athletic contests on campus.

He was also responsible for the purchase of two 9-passenger sedans which were the college's first vehicles for transporting students and staff to athletic events, meetings, or for presentations by choirs, dance groups, or other student groups. Whenever these vehicles were on the road, Dr. Byrd was usually driving one of them.

Dr. Byrd is married to the former Charlene Hodges, who is currently the Director for the National Center for Human Relations at WVSC.

In spite of his perpetual involvement with students and campus activities, Dr, Byrd is active in several community and civic organizations. Through it all, he is still trying to find time to do one more thing. GO BACK TO HAMPTON FOR A BRIEF VISIT!



Nellie E. Walker

Ms. Nellie Elizabeth Walker is the daughter of Mrs. Ernestine L. Walker and the late Mr. Charles W. Walker. Nellie graduated from Garnet High School and obtained an Associate Arts degree in 1956 and a Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from West Virginia State College

Nellie Began her career at WVSC in 1956 in the Office of Admissions and Registration. In 1957, she was assigned the responsibility, of certifying athletes academically and financially until she retired in July 1998.

Many of the coaches depended on Nellie's attentive concern for the athletes. Nellie's compassion was genuine for the athlete's academic development as well as personal growth. She knew every athlete by name and other profile related information, which exemplified the uniqueness of her rapport with athletes and the faculty and staff.

Ms. Walker became assistant basketball coach shortly after the College hired Barbara Lewis Clark Because of lack of funds for female athletes at that time, Nellie would often use her car to transport athletes to off-campus games. She also worked with the cheerleaders for five years.

Nellie is a member of the Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., WVSC Kanawha Valley Alumni Chapter., Alpha Kappa Mu National Honorary Society, and many other organizations.

All of us who have come in touch with Nellie agree that the following sums up just how we feel about her. During Nellie's recent retirement, Dr. Carter, President of West Virginia State, said, "Over the years you have touched thousand of lives and motivated students to persevere in their educational pursuits at "State," You have been a mentor to many who have walked the halls of this great College, We are fortunate that you will always be an important member of the WVSC family."


There is a place we love so dear— Its name we'll ever praise and revere 'Tis West Virginia State we love— Just one more step from there is Heav'n above.
