

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE WEST VIRGINIA STATE COLLEGE NATIONAL "W" CLUB

On a fall West Virginia Sunday morning in 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston, West Virginia hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm as to how to raise funds for athletics as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a very distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club elected at the 1976 meeting were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome, and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, DC was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters. The Institute Chapter and the Shennandoah Chapter which is located in Martinsburg, WV. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishing of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were: Chester A. Burris; Mark H. Cardwell; Samuel A. Gamble; Vasco D. Hale; Adolph P. Hamblin; Louis R. W. Johnson; Earl Lloyd; Floyd Meadows; Roderick L. Price and Marvin H. Richardson.

Former presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller and Madison Broadnax. In 1990, Henry R. Bellinger was elected to the presidency. Currently Cornelious "Papa" Jones serves as president.

On October 13, 1990, the WVSC Sports Hall of Fame, dedicated to Coach Mark H. Cardwell, was opened. This facility located in the Canty House on the campus of West Virginia State College, showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State College athletes.

CLASS OF 1960

Eleanor Beverly received her elementary and high school education in Portsmouth, Virginia and Baltimore, Maryland public school systems. She received a B.S. Degree in Physical Education from West Virginia State College, a Master's Degree in Administration and Supervision from Bowie State University in Maryland and has completed postgraduate work at both George Washington University and Trinity College in Washington, D.C.

While at WVSC, Eleanor was the only female member of the tennis team. She was also a member of the basketball team, where twice she was recognized as the Most Valuable Player and served three times on the All-Star team for the Women's Basketball League.

After graduating from State, she wore many hats in the Washington, D.C. area. Amongst some of her accomplishments were organizing and coaching championship teams in basketball, track and field, softball and baseball. She also played semi-professional softball, tennis and was a member of the Amateur Athletic Union Basketball League.

Later, she joined the public school system in D.C. where she coached six divisional championship teams, three city-wide championship teams, two citywide runner-up teams and three 3rd place teams. In volleyball, she coached one divisional championship team, one citywide championship team, and two 3rd place teams. She has also coached two 3rd place teams as a softball coach.

Eleanor is a committed member of Payne Memorial A.M.E. Church, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, and Phi Delta Kappa.



CHARLES DEXTER CARR


CLASS OF 1983

Charles was born in California and moved to West Virginia during his junior high years. He graduated from St. Albans High School where he made All-State Baseball 1977-79.

He chose West Virginia State College for his higher education where he excelled in baseball being on the All-Conference Team 1981-1983. In 1981 he was also the WVIAC Player, Hitter, and Region 4 Player of the Year. That year he was also 2nd Team All-American. During his senior year, he was chosen the WVSC "W" Club Senior Athlete of the Year. Charles holds several records at WVSC which are Most Home Runs in Career (57); Most Home Runs in a Year (18) in 1982; 2nd in Career Runs Batted In (157).

Charles has coached at many area schools and presently is the Athletic Director at South Charleston Junior High School and also the boys basketball coach.

He and his wife, Robin, and daughter, Allyson, reside in South Charleston.



WAYNE ELGIN CASEY

CLASS OF 1989

Wayne Elgin Casey is the son of Florence Walker Casey and Wayne D. Casey. Wayne is a graduate of Stonewall Jackson High School. While attending high school he was the captain of the team, All State player and a member of the 1985 state championship team. Wayne was selected most valuable player his final high school game.

Wayne accepted an athletic scholarship to attend West Virginia State College in 1985 and graduated in 1989 with a B.S. degree in Criminal Justice. During his college career, he received numerous awards: WVIAC Freshman of the Year, Sophomore NBA athletes to watch list and the NAIA National Tournament All-Tournament Team. During his junior and senior year he was Blue Ribbon 1st Team All-American, All WVIAC and West Virginia State College Most Valuable Player. He was Captain of the 1989 team. Wayne is listed as the second leading scorer in the school's history with 2,153 total points.

Wayne has played in the CBA League and has attended several NBA camps. He's also played in the European League having stints in Iceland, France, Australia, Philippines and China. He was voted MVP of the Icelandic League in 1994-95. This year Wayne was invited to play in the playoffs in France and replace NBA guard Sedal Threatt on the Limones team.

Wayne continues to serve as a role model for youth in the community. He directed the 1992 Wayne Casey basketball camp for the City of Charleston. He also worked with the National Summer Youth Program and coached various AAU teams.

Wayne is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity and is currently employed as an Investigator with the State of WV Public Defender's Office in Charleston.

He and his wife, Stephanie, are the proud parents of one daughter, Carissa Nicole.



BARBARA LEWIS CLARK


Barbara received her B.S. degree in Physical Education from Delaware State College and came to West Virginia State College in September, 1959, as an instructor after a year of teaching Physical Education and coaching women's basketball at Tuskegee Institute.

Immediately upon her arrival to State, she also became the women's basketball coach until 1975 and the cheerleader advisor until 1968. The cheerleading squads won first place honors for their performance during competition at the men's WVIAC basketball tournament in 1966 and 1967. She also coached the first seven years of tenure in church and industrial leagues in the Charleston area and added competition with Marshall University. Those teams won several first and second place trophies.

While at WVSC, Barbara served in many capacities. She served as a member of the planning and organizing committee; secretary of the first intercollegiate athletic association for women in WV; West Virginia State's representative to the WVIAA; member of the Athletic Committee; member/secretary of the Faculty Senate; member of the Constitution and By-Laws Committee; member of the Promotion and Rank Committee; chair of HPERS (one year).

Barbara was inducted in the Athletic Hall of Fame at Delaware State College in 1986 for participation in basketball, cheerleading and volleyball.

She retired from State in May 1996 as associate professor of Physical Education.



RON MOORE


Ron Moore is a native of Brooklyn, New York. He graduated from high school in Clarksville, Arkansas by way of Thomas Jefferson High School in Brooklyn. He was on the All-American, All State, and was listed in the top 100 high school players.

Ron transferred to West Virginia State College from then Salem College in 1984. At Salem, he was voted WVIAC 2nd Team All-Conference and 1st Team All-Conference. At WVSC, he was also voted WVIAC 2nd Team All-Conference. As a senior, he helped lead the Yellow Jackets in its best season in 20 years. The team won the conference championship, the conference tournament champs, and district champs. They finished the season as runner-ups in the NAIA national tournament. That year Ron was chosen WVIAC 1st Team All-Conference; 1st Team All Tournament; 1st Team All-American.

Ron played on several NBA teams and continued his pro career in Europe for six years.

He coached in area high schools in New York and is presently the Assistant Athletic Director and Head Women's Basketball Coach at Five Towns College in Suffolk County, New York.

Ron is the father of four children and resides in Queens, New York with his wife Tonya.



JAMES "BIG NICK" NIXON
CLASS OF 1955

"Big Nick" was born in Orange, New Jersey and later moved to Welch, WV where he graduated from Kimball High School in 1948. In 1948-49, he attended North Carolina A&T College on a football scholarship.

In 1950, he enrolled at WVSC also on a football scholarship. He played the 1951 and 1952 seasons and was named honorable mention All-American and All-CIAA defensive tackle. He was drafted into the military for two years. Upon his discharge in 1954, James returned to WVSC and completed his last two years at State on the football team. For those two years he was once again named All-CIAA defensive back.

Mr. Nixon is active in the Dayton WVSC Alumni Chapter and is a regular attendee to the West Virginia State College Homecomings!


