

A Brief History Of The West Virginia State College National "W" Club

On a fall West Virginia Sunday morning in 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston, West Virginia hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm as to how to raise funds for athletics as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a very distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club elected at the 1976 meeting were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer; and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome, and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, DC was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters. The Institute Chapter and the Shennandoah Chapter which is located in Martinsburg, WV. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishing of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were: Chester A. Burris; Mark H. Cardwell; Samuel A. Gamble; Vasco D Hale; Adolph P. Hamblin; Louis R. W. Johnson; Earl Lloyd; Floyd Meadows; Roderick L. Price; and Marvin H. Richardson.


Former presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller, and Madison Broadnax. In 1990, Henry R. Bellinger was elected to the presidency. Currently, Cornelius "Papa" Jones serves as president.

On October 13, 1990, the WVSC Sports Hall of Fame, dedicated to Coach Mark H. Cardwell, was opened. This facility, located in the Canty House on the campus of West Virginia State College, showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State College athletes.

A. L. "BUCK" DAWSON

Mr. A. L. "Buck" Dawson was born in Bradshaw, WV and came to West Virginia State College in 1967. He was an Assistant Professor in the Department of Health and Human Performance (formerly known as HPERS). He had additional duties as the Assistant Football Coach (Offensive Coordinator) and Head Track Coach.

Under Buck's leadership, the WVSC Track Team won the WVIAC Championship for five years. He continued his athletic skills at Morehead State University later moving to Lakeland Florida to continue his coaching. Under his guidance, his teams have won many championships including several NCAA II Regional Championships. Buck has also been chosen Sunshine State Conference Coach of the Year for Men's and Women's Cross Country for five consecutive years. He is currently coaching the Men's and Women's Cross Country Team at Florida Southern College.

Mr. Dawson resides in Lakeland, Florida with his wife. He is the father of three and grandfather of seven.



JOE DAWSON

CLASS OF 1972

Joe Dawson was born on April 1, 1946, in Carbon, WV to Spencer (deceased) and Letha Dawson. He graduated from East Bank High School in East Bank, WV and entered West Virginia State College in 1965 to continue his education. He received his B.A. degree in 1972 after a 2 year stint in the Army.

During his first year at WVSC, he was selected to the All WVIAC Team as halfback. He ranked second in the WVIAC rushing. In the Bluefield State game, he gained 226 yards on 26 carries and scored two touchdowns.

As a running back in 1966, he scored 9 touchdowns, caught 9 passes and rushed 826 yards in 7 games. In 1967, he was named WVIAC player of the week. He was outstanding in returning punts and kick offs, as well as rushing. Joe ranked second in the WVIAC. He was chosen twice as the WVIAC player of the week.

Joe attends Grace Bible Church in Charleston, WV and is employed as a recruiter for the Job Corps in Teays Valley and Charleston.



ELAINE DILLAHUNT

CLASS OF 1967

Elaine was born in Charleston, SC on February 14, 1945. She attended Immaculate Conception High School and graduated in 1963. She chose to attend West Virginia State College and graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Education in 1967.

While at WVSC, she played and lettered in basketball. She was honored to serve the team as captain and co-captain. Elaine was active in several organizations while a student at "State".

Elaine is also very active in the Anti-Apartheid Movement and has traveled internationally to Africa to participate in several conferences regarding racism and solidarity.

FREDRICK G. MCGLOTHLIN

CLASS OF 1966


A native of Bartley, WV, Mr. McGlothlin attended Excelsior High School in McDowell County and came to West Virginia State College in 1961. He earned a degree in Physical Education and Biology in 1966. While at "State", he played football, basketball, and baseball.

He played football for four years under Coaches Burris and Tolbert. He was co-captain his senior year and was "All WVIAC" lineman for 2 years. Fredrick played basketball for two years under Coach Cardwell and baseball for four years under Coach Gray. His batting average was .400 in 1964 and .292 in 1965.

Mr. McGlothlin continued demonstrating his athletic skills by becoming the coach of several sports in the Chicago public school system. Under his coaching, his football teams won two conference titles and two runners-up conference titles. In 1998 he was named "Coach of the Year" by the Prep Insight Teen Magazine.

He played professional football for the Chicago Owls, Chicago Panthers, and the Lake County Rifles. He also coached AAU and TAC track and field with the Chicago Zephyrs and was the founder and coach of the Astro Athletic Association.

FERGUSON B. MEADOWS, JR.

CLASS OF 1967

Lt. Col. Ferguson "Fergie" B. Meadows, Jr. was born in Charleston, WV on January 23, 1943 to Ferguson and Mary Elizabeth (deceased) Meadows. He attended Dunbar High School and continued his education at West Virginia State College where he graduated in 1967 with a degree in Sociology and a minor in Psychology and Philosophy.

While a student at WVSC, Fergie was active on the track team. Because he was so diligent in his participation with the program, upon graduation he was asked to be the Assistant Track Coach and Head Cross Country Coach. Through his leadership and tutelage, "State" won five championships and four of our athletes were chosen WVIAC Track Men of the Year for setting some of the fastest records in the state of West Virginia.

Dr. Meadows began his professional career at "State" as the Assistant Dorm Director and moved on to become the Head Dorm Director for Gore Hall. After that, he became head of the Counseling Center.

Fergie decided to join the National Guard and because of his affiliation with WVSC and the National Guard, was able to recruit students for his Alma Mater from all over the United States.

Dr. Meadows is a former member of the WVSC Board of Advisors and currently serves on our Board of Governors.

He is married to Hildred "Jean" Ferguson and they are the parents of three daughters.



BERNARD S. SAVAGE


CLASS OF 1972

Bernard Shaw Savage was born September 4, 1950 in Weirton, WV. He was one of three children born to the union of Bennie and Betty Savage. He graduated from Glenville High School in 1968 and continued his education at West Virginia State College where he graduated in 1972 with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Accounting.

During his four years at WVSC, he participated in track and field events where he continued his high school tradition of receiving recognition for his outstanding performances. Bernard set the school's record in the 100-yard dash that remains standing today. Because of his remarkable track achievements, he was named West Virginia State College's "Track Man of the Year".

Bernard was employed by Sherwin Williams for over twenty-eight years, where he started as an Auditor and worked his way to the position of Purchasing Manager.

Being inducted into the West Virginia State College's Sports Hall of Fame was a dream that completed his final race. Bernard has touched many lives and will be missed, but his legacy will remain for all to remember especially by his three children and five grandchildren.




ROBERT H. SAULSBURY

CLASS OF 1952

Mr. Saulsbury matriculated at West Virginia State College where he was a three-year player and captain of the WVSC basketball team his senior year. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in Physical Education in 1952.

Following graduation from "State", he spent almost ten years working at a variety of non-teaching jobs before he was given the opportunity to be an assistant coach at Cross by Verderame in 1961. After five seasons, he became head coach and enjoyed immediate success, leading the Governors to back to back state titles. Mr. Saulsbury brought national acclaim to the basketball program at Wilbur Cross High in New Haven. Bob coached championship teams in 1971-72; 1972-73; 1973-74; 1978-79; 1979-80; and 1980-81. In the 1973-74 season, his Governors won all twenty-four games and were ranked No. 1 in the country in a Washington Post poll. He never had a losing season and his teams have qualified for the state tournament every year.

Bob and his wife reside in New Haven. They are the parents of three, grandparents of four, and great-grandparents of six.




WILLIE G. SMITH

CLASS OF 1949

Willie G. Smith was educated in the public schools of East St. Louis, Illinois School District#189 before furthering his education at West Virginia State College in 1945 where he majored in Physical Education and Recreation and graduated in 1949.

While attending WVSC, Willie was on the 1948 CIAA Championship football team. When he graduated from "State", his high school principal sent a letter commending Willie for the outstanding work completed in the physical discipline.

In 1950, Willie was hired at Lincoln Senior High School in East St. Louis, IL, where his roots began years before. Ten championships were won from 1955 - 1959 in track and field, basketball, and football. Many outstanding students were taught at Lincoln High, including Gold Medallist Jackie Joyner Kersey and Coach Nino Fenney who coached the girls track team to more than fifteen Illinois State track titles.



CHARLES E. "CHUCK" STEWART

CLASS OF 1950

Charles E. "Chuck" Stewart was born in Youngstown, OH where he was educated in the public school system before coming to West Virginia State College. He majored in Biology - Psychology and graduated in 1950.

At WVSC, he was a member of the swimming team where he swam the 1500 yard free style and 400 yard relay. He also coached the swimming team from 1949-50. Chuck was a swimming instructor during his entire stay at "State" (1946-50).

After graduation, he worked in many camps and also taught swimming and lifeguard lessons.

He resides in California with his wife where he is a Senior Warden and vestry member of The Episcopal Church of the Advent. He is also a member of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity.
