A Salute to Our President



A Brief History of the West Virginia State University National "W" Club

On a fall West Virginia Sunday morning in 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston, West Virginia hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm as to how to raise funds for athletics as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a very distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club elected at the 1976 meeting were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer, and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome, and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, DC was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters, the Institute Chapter and the Shennandoah Chapter which is located in Martinsburg, WV. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishing of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were Chester A. Burris; Mark H. Cardwell; Samuel A. Gamble; Vasco D. Hale; Adolph P. Hamblin; Louis R. W. Johnson; Earl Lloyd; Floyd Meadows; Roderick L. Price, and Marvin H. Richardson.

Past presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller, Madison Broadnax, Henry R. Bellinger, and Cornelious "Papa" Jones. William Lipscomb was elected president in 2008.

The WVSC Sports Hall of Fame, located in the Canty House on the campus was dedicated to Mark H. Cardwell, Sr. on October 13, 1990. This facility showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State College athletes.


A special note of thanks to President Carter for officially designating the Canty House as headquarters for the WVSU National "W" Club.

BASEBALLMember of the 1951 WVSC Baseball Team


Walter Flournoy is a native of Richmond, Virginia and graduated from Armstrong High School. He enrolled in WVSC (University) in 1950 and played on the 1951 WVSC Baseball Team. Not only did Walter excel in baseball but, he received the honor of being named the Mathematic Student of the Year in his sophomore year. In 1951, Walter finished the year by playing with the Huntington Red Sox of the WV Tri-State Baseball League. He received a BS Degree in Mathematics with a minor in Physics and Biology. Walter was one of only six distinguished Military Graduates from WVSC in 1954.

Upon graduation Walter entered the Army as a 2nd Lieutenant forgoing a professional baseball contract offer with the Pittsburgh Pirates of the National League. He played organized baseball with the Ashland Cubs, an affiliate of the Negro Baseball League. Walter was first assigned to the 505th Infantry Regiment Baseball Team. Upon earning All-Star status, he received the honor of being selected to the 2nd Army All Star Baseball Team in 1955. He later played with the Fayetteville Cardinals, an affiliate of the Negro Baseball League. Walter received a contract offer from the Washington Senators in 1957, instead he chose to enter the ranks of the Federal Government as a Civil Servant in the field of Mathematics.

Walter has served as Treasurer of the WVSU National "W" Club from 1979 to the present. He is presently employed as a Senior Staff Engineer at the Goddard Space Flight Center, site of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). Walter enjoys nothing more than spending time with his son Geoffroi and his wife Mia, and his 2 grandchildren Kendyl and Quincy.

Mark Grimmett is the son of William and Mary Grimmett of Gauley Bridge, West Virginia. He graduated from Gauley Bridge High School in 1977. While there he was very active in baseball, football and basketball. Mark achieved All-State and All-Conference honors in all three sports. He was also selected for the McDonalds All American Team.

Mark led the West Virginia State (University) baseball team to three conference championships in 1978, 1979 and 1981. He had the lowest E.R.A in the nation of 0.88 in 1978 and that record still stands today. In 1979, he was selected as WVIAC Pitcher of the Year. In 1981, Mark signed as a free agent with the Cleveland Indians.

As an entrepreneur, he started North American Rebuild Company (NARCO) in Smithers, West Virginia. NARCO specializes in the manufacturing of underground mining equipment. His business has become one of the most successful businesses, gaining international recognition.

Mark now enjoys his time golfing, hunting and fishing and sponsors the Boy Scouts of America and the West Virginia Coal Association. In his hometown of Gauley Bridge, Mark sponsors all local high school and middle school sports programs as well, as the Little League.

Carlton "CJ" Jackson, son of Alberta and Amos Jackson, Sr. of Pompano Beach, Florida, entered West Virginia State College (University) in the spring of 1988 after graduating from Ely High School.

"CJ" was an NAIA 1st team All-American and WVIAC All Conference receiver in his senior year at WVSC. In 1990 he led the NAIA and the WVIAC in 87 receptions for the season, 1,468 yards in a season, 19 receptions in one game and 384 yards in one game. "CJ" set and still holds the record for the longest touchdown reception in NAIA, WVIAC and WVSC history, of 99 yards. In 1991, he received the Senior Athlete Award presented by the WVSC National "W" Club.

Not only did "CJ" perform outstanding on the football field but, he also excelled academically while attending WVSC. In December of 1990 he graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Criminal Justice. In 2007, "CJ" furthered his education by receiving a Master's Degree in Educational Leadership from Florida Atlantic University and is pursuing a Ph.D in Conflict Analysis & Resolution at Nova Southeastern University.

Carlton currently resides in North Lauderdale, Florida with his wife Kathy and three children, Carreon, Marquis and Carissa. He enjoys time spent with his family and serving as a member of the Board of Trustees and the Male Chorus at his church.

Francis A. Scott was born on May 6th, 1950 in Charleston West Virginia to William and Doris Scott. Francis graduated from Charleston High School in 1968, where he excelled in academics, wrestling, track and field. Upon graduation, he received scholarship offers from West Virginia University and West Virginia State (University). Being that his parents graduated from West Virginia State, Francis accepted the West Virginia State Track and Field scholarship and embarked upon his academic and sports endeavors.

Through dedication and pride to be the best, Francis and his teammates were honored by winning the WVIAC Track and Field Championships in 1969, 1970, 1971 and 1972. In his senior year, Francis set a new state shot-put record, qualified for the NCAA Division II National Track and Field meet and represented West Virginia State in Billings, Montana.
