



A Brief History of the West Virginia State University National "W" Club

On a Sunday morning in the fall of 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm how to raise funds for athletics as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" Club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club, elected at the 1976 meeting, were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer; and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, DC, was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters, the Institute Chapter and the Shennandoah Chapter, which is located in Martinsburg, WV. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishing of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were Chester A. Burris, Mark H. Cardwell, Samuel A. Gamble, Vasco D. Hale, Adolph P. Hamblin, Louis R. W. Johnson, Earl Lloyd, Floyd Meadows, Roderick L. Price, and Marvin H. Richardson.

Past presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller, Madison Broadnax, Henry R. Bellinger and Cornelious "Papa" Jones. William Lipscomb was elected president in 2008.

The WVSU Sports Hall of Fame, located in the Canty House on campus, was dedicated to Mark H. Cardwell, Sr., on October 13, 1990. The facility showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State University athletes.

A special note of thanks to the late President Emeritus Dr. Hazo W. Carter, Jr., for officially designating the Canty House as headquarters for the WVSU National "W" Club.

Reggie Coleman is the oldest son of George and Clara Coleman, both deceased, was born in Harrisburg, PA. He graduated from William Penn Senior High School in 1968. While there, he was active in baseball, basketball,

and achieved All-Conference and All-State honors in baseball.

Reggie led the West Virginia State College (University) baseball team to the Conference Championships in 1972 and 1974. He led the Conference in hits, extra base hits, home runs, runs batted in, and stolen bases in both seasons. His batting average of .451 was 25th in the nation in 1972. In 1974, his .478 batting average was fifth in the nation. Mr. Coleman was first team All-Conference in 1972 and 1974. In 1974, he was a first team All-American selection and also that year selected by the Cincinnati Reds.

He returned to WV State and earned a B.S. Degree in Criminal Justice. He moved to Fort Wayne, IN where he played professional softball and worked as a police officer, retiring as a homicide detective.

Reggie is currently head coach of the Indiana Cardinals semi-pro football team, the first undefeated football team in the history of Fort Wayne. He is also active with metro youth sports, whose football program is considered one of the best youth programs for football and basketball in the United States. Reggie also conducts baseball clinics and umpires for the East Allen County Baseball Program.

Mr. Coleman is the proud father of Darnell, Nicole, and Kecia.

In 1980, Wilfredo earned his B.S. Degree in Business Administration and was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the United States Army where he attained the rank of Major. As a college student, Wilfredo served as Basileus, Theta Psi Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. and was Mr. West Virginia State in 1979. He was also a member of the Pan-Hellenic Council, Student Government, ROTC, and The ARCH.

Over the last sixteen years, Wilfredo has had a successful career in sales as a Production Solutions Executive with Xerox Corporation and is a licensed Real Estate Consultant with Keller Williams Realty in Bradenton, Florida.



Dr. Lynn Smith, a 1958 graduate of Spingarn High School in Washington, DC, entered West Virginia State College (WVSC) to pursue a career in printing. He joined the track team as a freshman and became a member of the mile relay team that placed first and second in every

meet that year. That consistency helped the team go undefeated during the regular season and to become the first WVSC team to win a WVIAC Championship. At that meet, the mile relay finished second.

Upon graduation in 1962, he became a teacher at Cranston High School East, in Cranston, Rhode Island. In addition to teaching, he became the school's asst. varsity wrestling coach and its junior varsity coach. During a two year stint, those teams won two Conference and State Championships, a New England Championship, and a Conference JV Championship. Dr. Smith has served twenty-five years in senior staff positions in public education in Rhode Island and North Carolina; retiring as Executive Director, Auxiliary Services, Durham, NC.

He has been owner-operator of a staffing and training company, providing HR services to major New England corporations and institutions.

after graduating from Martin Luther King High School where he was a member of a Detroit public school league championship.

While at WVSU, Michael was a four year starter, a three year team captain, and set multiple season and career records. He is the third leading scorer in school history and ranks first all time in three pointers made. Michael finished his 2003-04 season with a 24.4 points per game average which was sixth best in the country for NCAA Division II. He also led the country in three point goals made per game with a 4.4 average. His individual honors include being named WVIAC Player of the Year and Division II All American in 2004. Michael helped lead the basketball team to the WVIAC Season Championship and a berth to the NCAA Tournament in 2004.

After leaving State, Michael was fortunate to have played three years of professional basketball in Holland, Germany, and Austria. He later moved on to the business side of sports where he worked in the NBA for the Chicago Bulls and Atlanta Hawks. He is currently in his sixth season working for the NBA and resides in Royal Oak, Michigan where he is the Director of Group Sales for the Detroit Pistons.

Michael is especially grateful to have played with amazing teammates and under an outstanding head coach and staff at WV State University.
