

#### A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE WEST VIRGINIA STATE UNIVERSITY NATIONAL "W" CLUB

On a Sunday morning in the fall of 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm how to raise funds for athletics, as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" Club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club, elected at the 1976 meeting, were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer; and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, D.C., was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club. The "W" Club has two chapters, the Institute Chapter and the Shenandoah Chapter, which is located in Martinsburg, W.Va. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club. In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishment of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were Chester A. Burris, Mark H. Cardwell, Samuel A. Gamble, Vasco D. Hale, Adolph P. Hamblin, Louis R. W. Johnson, Earl Lloyd, Floyd Meadows, Roderick L. Price and Marvin H. Richardson.

Past presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller, Madison Broadnax, Henry R. Bellinger and Cornelious "Papa" Jones. William Lipscomb was elected president in 2008.

The WVSU Sports Hall of Fame, located in the Canty House on campus, was dedicated to Mark H. Cardwell, Sr., on Oct. 13, 1990. The facility showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State University athletes. A special note of thanks to the late President Dr. Hazo W. Carter, Jr., for officially designating the Canty House as headquarters for the WVSU National "W" Club.

#### FRANKLIN E. BEACH Class of 1964

#### HONORARY INDUCTEE



Frank Beach is the son of Cecil and Nannie Beach of St. Albans, W.Va. He had five brothers and four sisters. Beach entered West Virginia State College's High School in 1954 and was the school's first and only white student graduating in 1957. While in high school he was known for his athletic ability in basketball and was the first white athlete to play in the State Negro High School Basketball Tournament at West Virginia State's gymnasium. Upon his high school graduation, Beach entered Bluefield State College and then

transferred to WVSU where he played three years of basketball, baseball and boxing.

Beach played in the WVIAC as well as being the first white student to play in the CIAA basketball conference. In 1958, he played on the Bluefield State College team that finished third in the tournament, the first year of integrated tournament play. In 1962, he played on the WVSU's baseball team that was runner-up in the WVIAC Conference tournament. He finished with a 3-0 pitching record and an ERA of 1.68.

After college, Beach coached football and track at Southwestern High School in Ohio and was a school teacher for 13 years in various schools between Ohio and West Virginia. He trained amateur and professional fighters in Ohio and West Virginia for 45 years, producing many national Golden Glove champions. Hundreds of young men boxed under his leadership. He coached the W.Va. College All Stars basketball teams for 20 years in the AAU tournaments in the West Virginia, Ohio and Kentucky areas.

Beach is an executive board member of the W.Va. All Black Schools Sports and Academic Hall of Fame and was inducted in the first group in 2008. He is currently a co-author with Dr. Phil Carter and Mr. Larry Peters (deceased) of the documentary "Afro American Athletes in Appalachia," which traces the history of West Virginia athleticism scheduled to be released soon.

Frank Beach resides with his wife, Leary Rose in Institute, W.Va. and is the proud father of seven children and several grandchildren. His love for sports continues to be the highlight of his life as he has shared his love through his gifts, time, and talent for the WVSU National "W"-Club for over 35 years.

George Crummel, the eldest of five children, was born and educated in Harrisburg, Pa. He attended William Penn High School and earned varsity letters for three years in cross country, wrestling and track and field. Crummel was the league champion during his senior year and state qualifier, and in his junior year finished second place in the state meet 4 x 880 relay. In 1970, Crummel was selected outstanding cross country runner by the Old Timers Club. Crummel arrived at WVSU in January 1971 with the encouragement and

assistance from alumni, William L Burney and Thomas "Skeeter" Hargis. Skeeter, who would become a mentor and friend to many students from Harrisburg and other places as well, helped Crummel transition into the new college environment.

The first indoor track practice started before daylight at six o'clock on a frosty, foggy morning with a knock on the door by Coach Dawson; but practice was never indoors. Four years would pass in similar fashion. While at State, George participated in others activities which include; ROTC, Glee Club, The Gospel Cavaliers, intramurals and he became a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. in 1972.

After graduating in 1976 with a bachelor's degree in education, Crummel returned to Harrisburg, Pa, where during the next 16 years he held several jobs and coaching positions. Crummel also continued to excel at running and earned two national titles at the age of 35. In 1989, he was awarded the Kelly Cup for Outstanding Performance in Keystone State Games.

In 1993, Crummel moved to Winston Salem, N.C. and worked for Winston-Salem Forsyth County schools until he retired in 2014. He attended Wentz Memorial UCC, was a member of the Chamber Choir, Secretary Treasurer and Chairman of the Men's Fellowship.

Crummel is blessed to have four daughters, one son, three grand-daughters and 10 grandsons.

Born in Anawalt, W.Va. in 1952, John L. Davidson, III is the oldest son of the late John L. and Lousinda Davidson. He graduated from Gary High School (Coaldigger), in 1970. Davidson was recruited by West Virginia State to play outside linebacker and after one year, the United States government terminated all college deferments, nationally, and he was drafted for the Vietnam conflict. Following his tour of duty, he returned and completed two summer school sessions and graduated with an associate degree in law enforcement and a

bachelor's degree in criminal justice.

After graduating from WVSU, John retired after 39 years of federal law enforcement service as a special agent for the Department of Justice and U.S. Parole Board (Court Services and Offenders Supervision Agency), Washington, D.C. He is currently in private practice specializing in domestic violence, anger management and substance abuse treatment. He also serves as the COO of the Prince Georges Coalition Against Domestic Violence in Prince George's County Maryland and is an adjunct instructor for U.S. Homeland Security.

Davidson has expressed his love for his Alma Mater through his services as President of the WVSU National "W" Club Shenandoah Valley Chapter for eight years and by making gifts of support of the construction of the Monroe Athletic Complex. The John L. Davidson, III Football Office is named in grateful appreciation for his dedicated service and generous support to WVSU yellowjacketnation4life. He is also a charter member of the Bullpen baseball team to ensure that Coach Calvin Bailey's legacy lives at State.

In addition to his work on the basketball court, Raines has been a leader in fundraising efforts

to support Yellow Jacket athletic programs, including leading successful sponsorship drives for the scoreboards and scorer's table in the new D. Stephen and Diane H. Walker Convocation Center. The court inside the Convocation Center bears Raines' name. "I love the enthusiasm, excitement and energy at West Virginia State," Raines says. "I came to WVSU because I wanted to be part of that. I am a very proud member of the State family."

Raines is a long-time booster of athletic programs throughout the region. He was a sponsor of the former WVIAC basketball tournament, as well as a sponsor of youth sports programs throughout the Charleston area. Donald Lee Riley was the oldest of eight children born to the late James Riley and Josephine (Riley) Joyce in Northfork, W.Va. Before coming to State, he ran track and played football for Elkhorn High School for Coach James Hairston. Riley turned down State to attend Bluefield State College, but two years later came to WVSU to continue his studies in math.

While at State, Riley played in the ROTC Band; ROTC Company Commander; was

named among Who's Who Among Students in Colleges and Universities; and Who's Who among Fraternities and Sororities. He also worked as a math tutor under Professor Andrew Aheart and was treasurer of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity. He graduated with a bachelor's degree in math with minors in physics and English. He entered the U. S. Army as a 2nd Lieutenant and left as a Major.

On the field, he was asked to come out for the track team by new coach Buck Dawson who was very creative in his training and preparation of his team. Coach Dawson convinced Riley to run the one event that he did not want to run. He gave him the baton at the start of the Mile Relay during the first conference meet in 1969. The Mile Relay was unbeatable. WVSU won the WVIAC Championship with ease with Riley being the lead-off for his team. State repeated in 1970 with Riley as the anchor. Coach Dawson once put him in four events (100, 220, 4x100 Mile Relay) to get points against Concord College. Riley scored 36 points to Concord's 18 points. He held the school record in the 440 for a short time.

Riley is the father of three sons: Don, Jr., J.R., and Warren; one daughter: Kristina; five grandchildren: Dejuantae, Nino, Katie, Caitlynn, Veronica and one great-grandchild; six sisters: Barbara, Phyllis, Aleto, Carolynn, Paula, Deborah and one brother, David.

Smith graduated from West Virginia State University earning a bachelor's degree in criminal justice. Later, he earned his master's degree in education. Currently, Smith works for the Shelby County Schools as a special education teacher. He serves as the head wrestling coach and assistant football coach at Memphis East High School. Charles has one daughter, Aliseea, and one son, Bernard.
