



A Brief History of The WVSU National "W" Club

On a Sunday morning in the fall of 1975, the day after West Virginia State's Homecoming, a group of West Virginia State College alumni met in a Charleston hotel. The agenda was to brainstorm how to raise funds for athletics, as well as restore athletics to the status of previous years. The open discussion was chaired by Attorney William Lonesome, an alumnus of the school and a distinguished leader.

After several hours of discussion, it was decided that a National "W" Club would be formed to raise funds for athletic programs.

A year later, in 1976, a meeting was held the night before the Homecoming game to formally establish a new National "W" Club.

The first officers of the National "W" Club, elected at the 1976 meeting, were: Dr. Frank E. Enty, president; Rupert G. Curry, vice president; Herbert B. Thompson, treasurer; and Herbert H. Henderson, attorney/secretary.

Attorney Herbert Henderson was assigned the responsibility of acquiring corporate status for the organization. The hard, long, pro-bono legal work of Mr. Henderson gained corporate status for the National "W" Club in 1978. The incorporators were Dr. Frank E. Enty, Rupert Curry, Herbert B. Thompson, William L. Lonesome and Herbert Henderson.

Washington, D.C., was selected as the home base for the National "W" Club.

The "W" Club has two chapters, the Institute Chapter and the Shenandoah Chapter, which is located in Martinsburg, W.Va. Both chapters are instrumental in the success of the National "W" Club.

Herbert Thompson wrote the first by-laws for the National "W" Club.

In 1979, at a "W" Club Homecoming meeting, Mr. Glover Smiley proposed the establishment of an Athletic Hall of Fame. It was voted on and passed by the membership. The first Hall of Famers were inducted in 1980. They were Chester A. Burris, Mark H. Cardwell, Samuel A. Gamble, Vasco D. Hale, Adolph P. Hamblin, Louis R. W. Johnson, Earl Lloyd, Floyd Meadows, Roderick L. Price and Marvin H. Richardson.

Past presidents of the National "W" Club are Dr. Frank Enty, Rupert Curry, Vandy Miller, Madison Broadnax, Henry R. Bellinger and Cornelious "Papa" Jones. William Lipscomb was elected president in 2008.

The WVSU Sports Hall of Fame, located in the Canty House on campus, was dedicated to Mark H. Cardwell, Sr., on Oct. 13, 1990. The facility showcases academic and athletic triumphs of West Virginia State University athletes. A special note of thanks to the late President Dr. Hazo W. Carter, Jr., for officially designating the Canty House as headquarters for the WVSU National "W" Club.



Staunch Life Time Supporter Of: National "W" Club

Life Time Member Of: WVSU National Alumni Association Judge Richard E. Fields was born and raised in Charleston, South Carolina. He graduated from West Virginia State College (WVSU) in 1944 and entered Howard University School of Law graduating in 1947. He was admitted to practice law in the District of Columbia and in the state of South Carolina in 1948. After his practice began in 1949 in Charleston, SC, he was the first minority black to open a law office in that city since the early 1900's and the first to ever become a litigator.

When returning to Charleston, Judge Fields resumed his membership in historic Centenary Methodist Church. He has held all of the following church positions: treasurer, delegate, member of three World Methodist Conferences, elected to the General Board of Finance and Administration. His portrait hangs in the foyer of Centenary United Methodist Church.

Judge Fields was also on the Board of Trustees of Claflin College (University), and his portrait hangs in the boardroom at Claflin. The Richard E. Fields Scholarship at Claflin University was established in 1992.

Judge Fields, with several businessmen, established the Liberty National Bank. He was on the committee to establish the Charleston School of Law and presently serves on the Advisory Committee to the School of Law.

Judge Fields was a Municipal Judge for the City of Charleston, a judge of the Family Court of Charleston County, and Judge of the Circuit Courts of South Carolina where he served until his retirement in 1992. Another memorable accolade was on August 2000, when President William Clinton named one of Charleston's Central Post Offices for Judge Fields. His portrait hangs prominently inside the post office. Upon his retirement, the local Charleston County Bar Association, along with the South Carolina Bar Association, raised a greater amount of money than needed for Judge Fields' portrait. The excess funds were divided among Avery Institute, West Virginia State University, and Howard University. The check for West Virginia State University was presented at homecoming in 1992. Judge Fields has maintained a close relationship with West Virginia State University and has contributed monetarily to the ongoing activities of the University. He holds a life membership in the West Virginia State University Alumni Association and the National "W" Club. Judge Fields has always supported the National "W" Club financially and continues to aid the Club in all aspects.

Judge Fields married the late Myrtle T. Evans, a Charleston County public school teacher. They have two children: a daughter, Mary Diane Fields-Reed, a graduate of Fisk University, and a son, Richard E. Fields, Jr., a graduate of Howard University

Quewanncoii C. Stephens, Sr. is a retired Army Lieutenant Colonel and the Community Resource Supervisor with the Bureau of Juvenile Services of the Division of Corrections and Rehabilitation for the state of West Virginia. "Col. Que," as his West Virginia State University (WVSU) family knows him, is a combat veteran of two Vietnam tours. He is a Purple Heart recipient and during his twenty-three years on active duty has trained and taught throughout the world as an Armor/ Calvary Officer, Special Forces ("Green Beret") Officer, Ranger and Jump Master/Parachutist. After his retirement from active duty, he was inducted into WVSU's ROTC Hall of Fame.

He holds a Commission as a Second Lieutenant from Florida A&M University, a Bachelor of Science in Social Studies from Campbell College (now University), and a Masters of Education in Counseling and Human Resources from Boston University.

On October 4, 1984, and during Homecoming Week at WV State College (now University), he arrived at State to take on the responsibility of Professor of Military Science. In 1986, having a personal desire to monitor many of his cadets in something other than the classroom, and having had the experience of Head Coach of the Fort Bragg "Packers" in North Carolina, he began serving State's football team in many capacities. He has worked as an assistant coach; Special Projects Coordinator; Counselor; photographer; team captain; bus


driver; and team motivator. He can always be heard on the field in his loud booming voice cheering the team on and yelling for them not to jump off sides.

Col. Que, who has worked as the Executive Director of the WV Human Rights Commission and a member of the WV Parole Board, has played a vital role in influencing his community. He is an ardent member and past president of the St. Albans Rotary Club; twice past president of the Dunbar Rotary Club; and a Paul Harris Fellow. He has been recognized as a recipient of the Governors Civil Rights Day. He is a devoted member of First Baptist Church where he sits on the Deacon Board; a member of the church choir; and is the church's photographer. He is also a bass singer with the Martin Luther King, Jr. Male Chorus and a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.

Quewanncoii C. Stephens, Sr. is the father of Eurydice Stephens Stanley, PhD, Lieutenant Colonel, US Army, Retired; Quewanncoii C. Stephens, II (former Mr. State) and Quinton Cy Stephens, both deceased. He is also a very proud grandfather.

He has two siblings Craig Anderson and Vicki Anderson Simons.

Percy's basketball journey began as an eighth grader at Public School 38 in Jersey City. Because of his outstanding basketball skills, he was recruited and accepted a full four-year scholarship to Saint Mary's Catholic High School. Under the tutelage of Coaches William Kuchar and Pete Romano and fellow team mate, Jimmy Boylan (NCAA Champion Marquette University/ Assistant Coach NBA Champions, Cleveland Cavaliers), he developed into one of Hudson County NJ's top scorers and rebounders. During his high school career, he was recognized for scoring over 1000 points and was one of the county's leading rebounders. In his senior year at Saint Mary's, Percy led his team to victory over the renowned Saint Anthony's High School basketball team coached by Hall of Fame's Coach Bobby Hurley, Sr. The Saint Mary's team went on to win the New Jersey State Parochial C championship.

Following graduation from high school, Percy worked out for Coach Curtis Price and was offered a four-year athletic scholarship to attend West Virginia State College. Working very hard, he became a starting player as a freshman. Under Coach Robert Maxwell, Percy, a true team player, led and inspired the team. His record places him as the 5th All-time Career FG% leader and 8th All Time Career Rebounder.

Percy received his Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice in 1980. His professional career has been with UPS Loss Prevention, Non-Profit Organizations, and Counselor for Juvenile offenders. He currently resides in Virginia and is a caretaker for his parents.

Booker and grandson of Charles L Booker and Mary L Booker, was born in Charleston, WV on December 23, 1976. He graduated from South Charleston High School in 1995 where he was a member of the 1994 State Championship football team. That year he received the Governors Citation award for Outstanding Athlete Dec 6, 1994, along with the Subway Honor Award for Outstanding Character, Excellent Attitude and Good Sportsmanship 1994. In addition to those awards he also was First Team All-Conference and First Team All-State as a Defensive Back in 1994. After high school Damon was invited to participate in the annual West Virginia North/South all-star football game where he met and made many lifelong friends.

Damon then made the decision to attend West Virginia State College and play football. While attending West Virginia State, Damon was a four-year letterman in football and was named WVSU Sophomore, Junior and Senior Athlete of the Year. In addition, during these years he was also selected WVIAC First Team All-Conference as a Sophomore, Junior and Senior. During his senior year, Damon was named preseason regional All-American. Damon's career rankings at State include tied 2nd in interceptions return for TD, 3rd in interceptions, 4th in interceptions return yards, tied 6th passes defended and 10th unassisted tackles. Damon takes pride in being a part of some of the best defenses that WVSU has ever fielded. He credits his coaches Defensive Coordinator Earl Monroe, Head Coach/Position Coach Carl Lee, and Offensive Coordinator Darnell Richardson for much of his success on the field, and also some great teammates that allowed him to be successful.

Damon knows that all of these accomplishments were only possible with the love, support and prayers of his family and close friends. He would also like to thank two very special men that have always been instrumental in his life Eddie Reeves and Benjamin (Duke) Bolton. Damon is now married to Jamie Booker and has four children, Makayla, Lawrence, Damon II, Devon, and resides in Columbus, OH. He has been employed by CSX Railroad for the past fourteen years where he works as an Engineer. In his free time he enjoys traveling, volunteering to coach the Reynoldsburg Junior Raiders football team as well as spending time with his family and friends.

He received a BS Degree in Physical Education from Springfield College in Springfield, MA in 1959.

His first head football coaching position was at New Milford High School in New Milford, NJ, winning three Conference Championships in six years. In 1965 -1967, while earning his Master's Degree in Physical Education, he joined the coaching staff at Michigan State University, as a graduate assistant, under the legendary coach Duffy Daugherty.

Coach Cameron arrived on the West Virginia State College campus in 1967 as defensive coordinator under Head Coach Dick Tredway. He became the Head Football Coach in 1968 leading the Yellow Jackets to their first, and only, WVIAC Football Championship. He was appointed Athletic Director in 1969 in addition to his football responsibilities.

In 1977 he moved on to Fairmont State University as Director of Athletics and Chairman of the Department of Health and Physical Education where he retired, after twenty years of service, in 1997.

Colin married his high school sweetheart in 1959 and they will celebrate their 60th anniversary in August, 2019. Colin and Marian are the proud parents of the late Brad Cameron and Susan Cameron, a middle school teacher in Winter Haven, FL. 


His freshman year, Keith joined the WVSC Yellow Jackets football team as a guarterback and led the team in total offense and received Honorable Mention All WVIAC Team. His sophomore year was a year to remember as he led one of the greatest football teams in West Virginia State history to an 8-1-1 record and was the WVIAC Conference Champions. That year he was named the WVIAC Offensive Player of the Year and the Overall WVIAC Conference Player of the Year. He won Player of the Week 6 times that year. He was also named to the NAIA All American Team. His junior year was a repeat of his sophomore year as he was named the WVIAC Offensive Player of the Year and the Overall WVIAC Conference Player of the Year. He won Player of the Week 5 times that year and he led the nation in total offense for 4 weeks and again received NAIA All American honors. His senior year Keith broke several West Virginia State offensive records and became the WVIAC Conference record holder in total offense and was named to the WVIAC All Conference Team again.

Following graduation for WVSC, Keith decided to return home and teach mathematics in the Broward County School system in Fort Lauderdale, Florida, where he has been for 27 years. His greatest love of all, outside of his family, has been coaching and mentoring studentathletes for 29 years and several high schools in Broward County and has been a head coach at several schools for the last 17 years. He has placed over 300 student-athletes into colleges across the country and several players have gone on to play in the NFL and super bowl games.

Football & Track 4-Year Letterman Quarterback Single game record for passing yards Single game record for total offensive yards WIAC Track Athlete of the Year WVIAC Track record holder of 132^{1/2} points Tyrone Smith, born November 23, 1959 in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, is the last of four children born to Juliaette and the late Isaac Smith. With his mother who spent over 40 years as a teacher and older siblings Anthony, Vernida and Kenneth providing guidance, Tyrone became a 1978 graduate of McKinley High School in Baton Rouge, Louisiana where he was a four-sport star athlete. He twice earned "Athlete of the Year" honors "Outstanding Field Man" in track and field and "Sixth Man of the Year" in basketball. Upon graduation from McKinley High, Tyrone, AKA "Smitty" to friends and family, received a scholarship to West Virginia State College.

At West Virginia State, Tyrone was a four-year letterman and a twosport standout in football and track and field. In football, he played both quarterback and wide receiver. As a quarterback, he set both the single-game record for passing yards and the single game record for total offensive yards. As a wide receiver, he caught many passes that either scored touchdowns or led to drives that scored touchdowns for the Yellow Jackets. In track and field, he led his team to two WVIAC Champions. He won 1st place in the long jump, the triple jump, the 4x400 relay and 2nd in the javelin throw. He was named WVIAC "Track Athlete of the Year". Upon graduation, he held the West Virginia Conference Track Meet all-time record of 132 1/2 points.

Tyrone graduated with a Bachelor of Science degree in Administration Recreation Management. After graduation Tyrone moved to the Atlanta, Georgia area and for more than 30 years Tyrone has been a staple in the North Atlanta area's youth sports programs. He has used his many gifts to provide education, mentoring and guidance

to many children through coaching youth programs. He opened the doors to his home to many and has been instrumental in sending many young kids to college. He has coached and mentored many athletes who have become professional athletes in the NBA, the NFL and MBL. He continues to offer his time, talent and treasure to the children in North Atlanta.

He is an active member of the Salem Missionary Baptist Church where is also a member of the Men's Choir. He is also a member of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. Tyrone has been married to Kimberly Gordon Smith class of 88' for over 29 years. Their union has produced three outstanding student-athletes of their own, Tyrone James "TJ" Smith II, Tyra Janae Smith and Trey Jaleel Smith. All three children were student-athletes and have graduated college. Tyrone also received a precious gift this past year in the form of his first grandchild Taylor Corey Michelle Foster.

Dr. Reed, is a former 24-year veteran teacher who moved on to become Superintendent of DC Public Schools as well as many other successes.

Dr. Reed is a proud graduate of West Virginia State College. In fact, as a defensive tackle at Sumner High School, in Missouri, he was given the opportunity to attend West Virginia State on a football scholarship. While at WVSC, his talents as defensive and offensive tackle earned him a place in the Football Hall of fame at his beloved Alma Mata.

In 1981, he became Assistant U.S. Secretary of Education with former President Reagan's administration. He was in charge of federal aid programs for elementary and secondary schools. Dr. Reed was one of the highest-ranking African Americans among the Reagan administration.

In 1982, he accepted the position of Vice President for Communications of the Washington Post, where he was in charge of the newspaper's public relations and school services programs. He was the only African American among the newspaper's 10 vice presidents.

In 2015, Washington Post Writer Jay Matthews said, "Dr. Reed was one of the best DC School Superintendents ever. Reed inspired a revolt against the school board that thought challenging low-income students was an elitist pipe dream."
